11. Executive committee

In terms of the constitutional provisions, 99 members should be in the executive committee, from which 07 members, and professionally two members such as present District Coordinator and elected secretary, altogether 09 members consisting to the director board. 99 members comprise from the 33 villages has elected in to office at the annual general meeting held every one years. 09 members in the Director board will function with positions for two years.

These branches shall consist of 05 members groups 10 to 40 and the leader from the rural village administrative committee will function accordingly. This formation shall have a way to share and discuss experiences, changes and conduct different committee and this would enable to study matters left out towards the correct path. This structure of the branch is instrumental to identify its needs and to fulfill them as far as possible. And given

them training program in the trade that they willing to involve for the period of three months.

After the completion of the training program the organization tries offer them a revolving loan to develop their self employment. For the need of money, PEEDO forward the member to the **Peoples bank** to obtain loan of Rs. 25,000.00. The organization has taken full responsible for the recoveries. To obtain a loan from peoples bank, organization away instructed to the members who have completed the training and entitled to involve in the self employment program. Who wanted to involve in this program, to obtain a loan they must follow the following condition by the Organization.

- ❑ To be open an investment saving account
- ❑ To be put continue deposit for over six months
- ❑ To be open a savings account
- ❑ And make ready to start the self employment project with the beneficiary's contribution
- ❑ Should submit a recommendation letter from Grama Seva Niladhari to identify them as a permanent resident

If the organization evaluation committee suggested the project, and if they thing that this could be carryout in a proper manner, they would be recommend the project to the director board, The Director board will be recommend the beneficiaries to the bank with three member unit.

Under this circumstance the Organization has recommended over 800 beneficiaries to people bank considering well arranged and opened I. S. A. accounts and obtained loan for 225 a sum of Rs. 5,625,000.00 and made 100% recoveries and repaid to the bank during the past 18 months.

12. Relationship with National Development Trust Fund (NDTF)

We have obtain a repayable loan of Rs. 85,000,000.00 (Eighty five million) from National development Trust Fund for the self employment program in which we have Distributed lagoon caves and fishing equipments to three villages named as Thampattai ,Munaiyoor and Thambiluvil – 01, in Thirukkivil Divisional Secretariat area.


With the request of the members, another credit appraisal had been submitted to NDTF for Rs. 80,000,000.00 (Eighty million) for the year 2009.

The present membership of **PEEDO** is approximately 5488 whom are 98 % women, representing from rural village and had been formed into 33 grass–root level groups with community leaders for effectiveness.

The Formation of committees among the rural villagers and maximum commitments of women in decision making.



PEEDO has been successful in implementing several activities for the past 11 years in the name of sweido vision particular we hope that the initiative to provide more responsibilities to the women in the following activities through committees shall expand gradually and lead to great changes eventually. These changes are referred as permanent development.

14. Description (Organizations) :

PEEDO Kovil Road, Thirukkovil, Based in Ampara District was formed in 28th August 1997 in the name of Sweidovision, as a result of various felt needs that arose in the midst of the crisis situation, where **violence and conflicts took place in this area in 1990** is a serious true in the eastern province. The people of Thirukkovil and refugees come from various parts of the North & Eastern provinces were badly affected and were displaced here and there from time to time.


Some Lost of the life and some lost of their bread winners and extensive damages to their properties caused economics hard ships to the large section of the rural population required immediate attention for rehabilitation in all forms. People displaced from the war affected area in the northern and eastern provinces and temporarily hutted in this area and been waited for the fulfillment of their needs and expectances.

Ignorance and lack of knowledge among the rural communities, that we have compelled by a group of humanitarian volunteers to form as an organization with rural community based membership of both sex, to address their grievances initially. This organization functioned with their own resources helping in re-settlement, providing some dry rations, no food relief items, cooking utensils and medical attentions to the needy peoples, also with available support from affluent benefactor's financial assistance's with also provide to the needy benefactors.

We also received recognition and legal status with the registration under the department of social services. Our services were required to improve the shuttered socio-economic condition of the poor affected people giving focus of attention to the rural community. Appropriate approaches were devised and planned with skills to tackle in the 1st instance, and the problems of the traditional belies customs and religion – cultural misconceptions, that are required maintain gender equality and woman development activities, to achieve socio economic development. This necessitated greater participation to under tale and affective change in the community.

Groups mobilization work at grass-root level were highly successful and our Organization activities have spreader to 13 village units which comprise the affected people. We are now increased 33 branch committees with coordination officers in each of these units supervised by the field officers based on the democratic principles. Our organization is now achieving the status of the affective dynamic popular. Lack of knowledge ignorance and apathy still prevails in the rural communities and this root cause has to be eradicated among the rural base communities to enable them to face the challenges Conventional role of woman in geranial to be changed and their contribution in socio economic context become essential today's youths and other hands, should be trained guided properly and used in the economic development based on rural resource utilization rather than white color job competitions which is becoming beyond the reach in the present situation, imparting knowledge, creating awareness for the attitude chine are the main concern.

The needs to strengthen this humanitarian service, in the formation of PEEDO with wider membership mobilization under a constitutional frame work.
